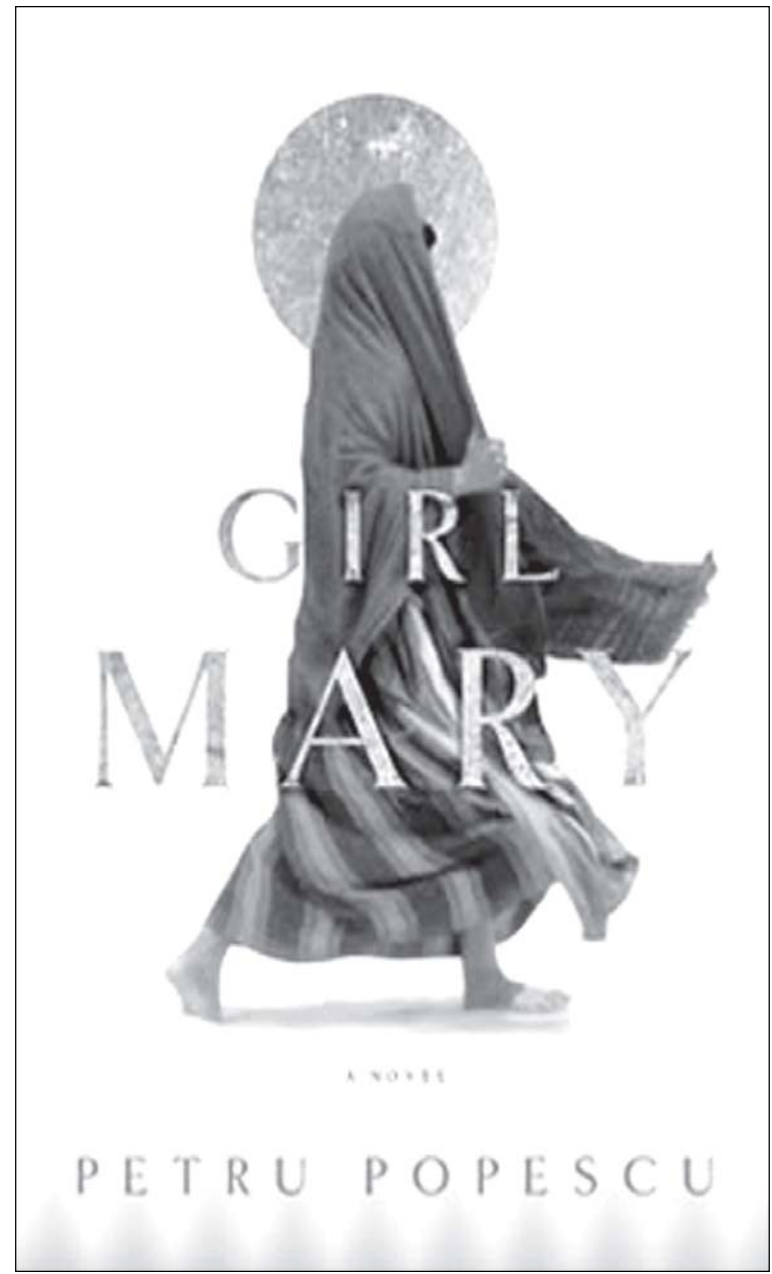

New Romanian Euro-Deputies take up office in Strasbourg

The new Romanian MEPs, elected on June 7, participated in Strasbourg, in the opening of the 2009-2014 legislature of the European Parliament (EP), along with the Euro-deputies of the other 26 member states of European Union.

Democrat-Liberal MEP Cristian Preda said that there was an impressive solemnity, which meant the first contact of the new MEPs with the institution Romania will represent.

According to Preda, the validation of the mandates of two new MEPs of all the 27 member states will take place on Monday, after the election of the new president of

the EP, after the mandate of Hans Gert Poettering.

The new European Parliament, elected at the poll of June 4-7, organized in all the 27 EU member states, will hold, on Tuesday, in Strasbourg, the constitutive plenary meeting. The 736 members of the EP, among them the 33 Romanians, will elect on Tuesday, the president and the 14 vice-presidents of the EP.

As regards the Romanian MEP, it is for the first time that they will have a complete mandate of five years. After the Euro-parliamentary election of Nov 25, 2007, Romania, that has become a EU member on

Jan 1, 2007, had 35 representatives in the European Parliament, for around one year and a half, until the election on June 7.

From the 33 Romanian MEPs who will take over officially their mandate on Tuesday, in Strasbourg, 13 are for the first time in this position. They are Sabin Cutas, Catalin Ivan and Ioan Enciu (PSE-PSE+PC), Monica Macovei, Traian Ungureanu, Cristian Preda, Petru Luhan, Elena Antonescu, Elena Basescu (EPP/PD-L). Norica Nicolai (ALDE/PNL), Corneliu Vadim Tudor, George Becali and Ciprian Claudiu Tanasescu (PRM).

They other 20 Romanian Euro-deputies are Adrian Severin, Rovana Plumb, Ioan Mircea Pascu, Adriana Ticau, Daciana Sarbu, Corina Cretu, Victor Bostinaru, Viorica Dancila (PSE/PSD+PC), Theodor Stolojan, Marian Jean Marinescu, Iosif Matula, Sebastian Bodu, Rares Niculescu (EPP/PD-L), Adina Valean,

Renate Weber, Ramona Manescu, Cristian Busoi (ALDE/PNL), Corneliu Vadim Tudor, George Becali and Ciprian Claudiu Tanasescu (PRM).

In order to celebrate 30 years since the holding of the first direct election for the European Parliament, but also as a welcome for the new MEP, on Monday afternoon, in Strasbourg, the European flag was hoisted and a concert of classical music was held.

The Philharmonic of Strasbourg and the Petit Chanteurs chorus gave a concert in front of Louise Weiss Building of the European Parliament in Strasbourg, to which both current and former members of the EP were present. Sung was the overture of the opera Force of Destiny by Giuseppe Verdi, then the members of Eurocorps hoisted the blue flag with 12 golden stars, and at the end of the festivity sung was the Ode to Joy, by Ludwig van Beethoven.

The first plenary session of the newly elected European Parliament will start on Tuesday, when all the 736 Euro-deputies will be met by president Hans-Gert Pottering, who will preside, for the last time in this capacity, the meeting at which elected will be the vice-presidents of the European Parliament on a common ballot paper. The mandate of the vice-presidents and of the president of the EP have a fixed length of two years and a half.

On Wednesday, the first half of the day will be dedicated to the priority debate, during which Czech PM Jan Fischer will present the results of the European Council of June 19, as well as the balance of the first half of the year, with the Czech Republic holding the presidency of the EU. For his part, Swedish PM Frederik Reinfeldt will present in front of the new EP the priorities of the current Swedish presidency of the EU.

Following the proposal of the Conference of presidents, bringing together the president of the EP and the leaders of the political groups, the European Parliament will adopt the membership of the parliamentary committees, and next held will be the meetings for the setting up of the 12 permanent committees.
